Anabaptism at 500, Springs Mennonite Church Committee

The Anabaptist movement began 500 years ago (January 1525) when a small group of Christians gathered secretly, renounced their infant baptism, and were baptized as adults. Anabaptists were so named by their enemies because they practiced believer's baptism rather than infant baptism, and many of them paid for this decision with imprisonment, torture, and even their lives.

The Elders have appointed the following people to serve on a committee to consider ways to commemorate the Anabaptist movement: Sherry Abel, Carolyn Tice, Enos Tice, Phoebe Wiley, Ben Yoder, and Richard Yoder. The Committee invites your prayers, suggestions, and any questions you might have.

The Committee's overall goal is: To retell our salvation history story, emphasizing the 500-year Anabaptist history in a way that encourages Springs Mennonite Church and other participants to learn from our past, both failures and successes, to find renewed joy in serving God, and to be wholehearted followers of Jesus. Based on stories in the Bible and church history, typically when people remember and correctly understand their salvation history story, they more faithfully follow God. When they forget their story, or misunderstand their story, they become distracted by other gods. The committee is planning to share some of this story during Sunday morning worship services. Some videos and other resources are also being considered.


