

"True evangelical faith cannot lie dormant; it clothes the naked, it feeds the hungry; it comforts the sorrowful; it shelters the destitute; it serves those that harm it; it binds up that which is wounded; it has become all things to all creatures."

"We who were formerly no people at all, and who knew of no peace, are now called to be. . .a church. . .of peace. True Christians do not know vengeance. They are the children of peace. Their hearts overflow with peace. Their mouths speak peace, and they walk in the way of peace."

Anabaptist Framework, from Palmer Becker's book Anabaptist Essentials

- Jesus is the center of our faith. Anabaptists worship a risen Christ. By placing Jesus at the center of our faith, we view the rest of Scripture through the lens of Jesus, the fullest revelation of God.
- 2. Community is the center of our life. We are committed to each other, both in expressions of forgiveness in community and the reading and interpretation of Scripture. In reading Scripture together, we gain a fuller picture of what God is like. When we encounter life and Scripture together in community, we build a better and fuller picture of what God is like and how God is moving in our midst.
- 3. **Reconciliation is the center of our work.** This reconciliation is both personal and social. It is the coming together of evangelism and peacemaking. We seek justice and we seek right relationships with ourselves, others, and our triune God. This creates a theology built around a constant dying to self, not a one-time ticket-to-heaven conversion experience.

Anabaptist theology and practice have much to offer our splintered and fragmented world. Placing Jesus as the center of our faith, community at the center of our life, and reconciliation at the center of our work has the power to transform.


