Alleghany Mennonite Conference- Fall Gathering

Alleghany Mennonite Conference held their fall gather via zoom on November 7th the moderator LeAnne Zook conducted the meeting. Springs Mennonite church sent via zoom John Verburg, Julia Tice, Shirley Brandes, Doug Berg, Harriet Berg, Enos and Carolyn Tice, and Isaac Tice as our 7 delegates to the meeting.

Items of business included a report by Karin Miller from Springs Mennonite Church that the budget that was adopted for fiscal year 20-21 is balanced and on schedule with respect to expenses and income for the first 4 months of year. Joy Cotchen reported that the winter snow camp at Laurelville will be held via zoom. Laurelville is expecting to hold summer camps for children this year and plans are underway registration for summer camp will start February 1st. Joyce Hall reported that plans are underway for Mennonite Church USA meetings in Cincinnati, OH in July. The meetings will be a hybrid of virtual and physical attendance.

The majority of the meeting was conducted by Dave Mishler conference minister and had to do with the sale of the International Guest House. The residence was purchased in 1966 by Alleghany Mennonite conference and operated by the Hyattsville congregation for the past 53 years. This ministry and outreach has now come to an end and the residence is being sold. The IGH was listed on the market for \$1.1 million and has sold for \$1.35 million the closing on this sale will take place somewhere between November 12 and November 19th. The proceeds from this sale were agreed to by the leadership council and the pastoral committee, and was presented for a vote by the conference at this meeting. The proceeds will be distributed as follows:

- 1- A 10% tithe from this sale will go directly to Mennonite Church USA
- 2- The remaining 90% allocation will be as follows:
Approximately 15% will go to cover expenses of the sale (realtors fees, transfer taxes, and miscellaneous repair expenses to get the building ready for sale) the remaining funds will be distributed as follows: 35% will go to the Hyattsville congregation and 50% will go to Alleghany Mennonite conference.

The Allegheny Mennonite, conference leadership council and pastoral committee will now start working on determining the best distribution of our funds. Initial recommendations will be made by these groups at the spring gathering which is scheduled for early March 2021. This meeting will also be conducted via zoom at that time.
