Romans 1:18-21

¹⁸ The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of people, who suppress the truth by their wickedness, ¹⁹ since what may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. ²⁰ For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.

**Elders Meeting
September 21, 2021**

1. Sherry did the devotional and opened in prayer:
 - a. What God says about overcoming obstacles – Joshua 1:9 and Deuteronomy 31: 6, 8.
2. Communion will be on October 3rd
 - a. Discussion on how to do the communion – It was decided to continue as in the recent past because of the COVID cases increasing again.
 - b. After October, the next communion will be in February. Four communions a year are planned.
3. Due to the recent increase of COVID cases and the growing number of hospitalizations and deaths, the Elders recommend and strongly encourage congregants to wear a mask to church in the near term. We acknowledge the inconvenience to all, but believe this to be a responsible path to walk together.
 - a. There will be masks available in the back of the church.
 - b. Pastor John will make sure this is in the bulletin on Sunday, and will send out a phone message as well.
4. Ken spoke to Carolyn Tice about Sunday school; it will not start up in October or November. The COVID situation will be re-evaluated for December. When Sunday school for the children starts up, it will be in an open area, not in the small classrooms. This includes Children's Church as well.
5. Don Green will be the Elder Chair, and Sherry Abel will continue as the secretary for the coming year.
6. Pastor John wants the children to play a part in the worship service
 - a. My Coins Count - The Elders recommend not having the children go to every pew to collect the coins, but instead stand in the back of the church to collect them.
Note: Children will need to wear masks when collecting coins.
7. Plans are being made to have an outside Christmas Eve Service this year.
8. The following happens at every Elders meeting: we receive prayer requests, and the Pastor and every Elder prays for the requests and for the Church.
